## Pattern Instructions

### Dress

1. **Row 1:** Ch 54, hdc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. (53 hdc)
2. **Row 2:** Ch 3, hdc in next hdc and in each hdc across. (53 hdc)
3. **Rows 3-21:** Repeat Row 2.
4. **Row 22:** Ch 3, inc hdc in next hdc, hdc in next 50 hdc, dec hdc in next 2 hdc. (53 hdc)
5. **Rows 23-33:** Repeat Row 22.
6. **Row 34:** Ch 3, hdc in next hdc and in each hdc across. (53 hdc)
7. **Row 35:** Ch 3, dc in next hdc and in each hdc across. (53 dc)
8. **Rows 36-44:** Repeat Row 35.
9. **Row 45:** Ch 3, inc dc in next dc, dc in next 25 dc, dec dc in next 2 dc, dc in next 22 dc. (56 dc)

10. **Rows 46-56:** Repeat Row 45.
11. **Row 57:** Ch 3, dc in next dc and in each dc across. (56 dc)
12. **Row 58:** Ch 3, hdc in next dc and in each dc across. (56 hdc)
13. **Rows 59-79:** Repeat Row 58.
14. **Assembly:** Sew side seams together. Insert ribbons through the top row of hdc for shoulder straps.

## **Jacket**

1. **Row 1:** Ch 44, hdc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. (43 hdc)
2. **Row 2:** Ch 3, hdc in next hdc and in each hdc across. (43 hdc)
3. **Rows 3-25:** Repeat Row 2.
4. **Row 26:** Ch 3, hdc in next 4 hdc, sl st in next hdc, ch 2, skip next hdc, hdc in next 38 hdc. (42 hdc, 1 armhole)
5. **Row 27:** Ch 3, hdc in next 4 hdc, turn.
6. **Row 28:** Ch 1, hdc in each hdc across. (13 hdc)
7. **Rows 29-34:** Repeat Row 28.
8. **Row 35:** Fasten off and weave in ends.
9. **Right Armhole:** Repeat Rows 26-35 for the right armhole.
10. **Assembly:** Sew side seams and armhole seams together.

## **Hat**

1. **Round 1:** Ch 6, sl st to join into a ring. (6 sc)

2. **Round 2:** Ch 2, 2 sc in each sc around. (12 sc)
3. **Round 3:** Ch 2, \*2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc; repeat from \* around. (18 sc)
4. **Round 4:** Ch 2, \*2 sc in next 2 sc, sc in next sc; repeat from \* around. (24 sc)
5. **Round 5:** Ch 2, \*2 sc in next 3 sc, sc in next sc; repeat from \* around. (30 sc)
6. **Round 6:** Ch 2, \*2 sc in next 4 sc, sc in next sc; repeat from \* around. (36 sc)
7. **Round 7:** Ch 2, \*2 sc in next 5 sc, sc in next sc; repeat from \* around. (42 sc)
8. **Round 8:** Ch 2, \*2 sc in next 6 sc, sc in next sc; repeat from \* around. (48 sc)
9. **Round 9:** Ch 2, \*2 sc in each sc around. (48 sc)
10. **Round 10:** Ch 1, sc in each sc around. (48 sc)
11. **Rounds 11-15:** Repeat Round 10.
12. **Decrease Rounds:**
  - **Round 16:** \*Sc in next 6 sc, 2 sc tog; repeat from \* around. (42 sc)
  - **Round 17:** \*Sc in next 5 sc, 2 sc tog; repeat from \* around. (36 sc)
  - **Round 18:** \*Sc in next 4 sc, 2 sc tog; repeat from \* around. (30 sc)

- **Round 19:** \*Sc in next 3 sc, 2 sc tog; repeat from \* around. (24 sc)
- **Round 20:** \*Sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc tog; repeat from \* around. (18 sc)
- **Round 21:** \*Sc in each of next 2 sc, 2 sc tog; repeat from \* around. (12 sc)
- **Round 22:** \*Sc in each of next 2 sc, 2 sc tog; repeat from \* around. (6 sc)

13. **Fasten off:** Cut yarn, leaving a long tail. Draw tail through remaining loops and pull tight to close the top of the hat



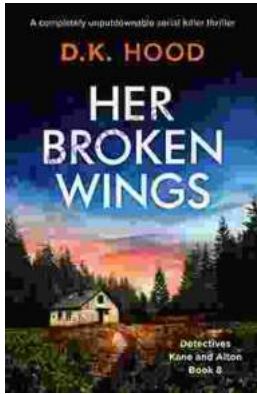
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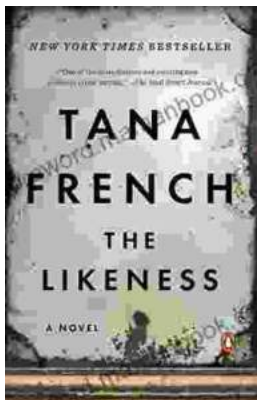
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
