## **Materials**

- Worsted weight cotton yarn in yellow (approx. 200 yards)
- Size H (5mm) crochet hook
- Yarn needle
- Scissors

## **Instructions**

### **Part 1: Rose Motif**

1. Round 1: Magic ring, ch 3 (counts as dc), 11 dc in ring, join with sl st to top of ch-3 (12 dc).
2. Round 2: Ch 3 (counts as dc), 2 dc in each dc around, join with sl st to top of ch-3 (24 dc).
3. Round 3: Ch 3 (counts as dc), \*2 dc in next dc, dc in next dc, repeat from \* around, join with sl st to top of ch-3 (36 dc).
4. Round 4: Ch 3 (counts as dc), \*3 dc in next dc, dc in next 2 dc, repeat from \* around, join with sl st to top of ch-3 (48 dc).
5. Round 5: Ch 3 (counts as dc), \*4 dc in next dc, dc in next 3 dc, repeat from \* around, join with sl st to top of ch-3 (60 dc).

6. Round 6: Ch 3 (counts as dc), \*5 dc in next dc, dc in next 4 dc, repeat from \* around, join with sl st to top of ch-3 (72 dc).
7. Round 7: Ch 3 (counts as tc), \*2 tc in next dc, dc in next 5 dc, repeat from \* around, join with sl st to top of ch-3 (84 tc).
8. Round 8: Ch 3 (counts as dc), \*dc in next 2 tc, 2 dc in next tc, repeat from \* around, join with sl st to top of ch-3 (96 dc).
9. Round 9: Ch 3 (counts as tr), \*2 tr in next dc, dc in next 3 dc, repeat from \* around, join with sl st to top of ch-3 (108 tr).
10. Round 10: Ch 3 (counts as dc), \*dc in next 2 tr, 2 dc in next tr, repeat from \* around, join with sl st to top of ch-3 (120 dc).
11. Round 11: Ch 3 (counts as hdc), \*hdc in next 2 dc, 2 hdc in next dc, repeat from \* around, join with sl st to top of ch-3 (132 hdc).
12. Round 12: Ch 3 (counts as sc), sc in each st around, join with sl st to top of ch-3 (132 sc).
13. Fasten off and weave in loose ends.

## **Part 2: Leaves**

1. Ch 4, slip stitch in 2nd ch from hook, ch 1, turn.
2. Sc in each ch across, turn.
3. Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.
4. Ch 1, 2 sc in each sc across.
5. Fasten off and weave in loose ends.

## **Part 3: Assembly**

1. Position the rose motif on the oven door and secure it with safety pins.
2. Using the yarn needle and yarn, sew around the edges of the motif to attach it to the oven door.
3. Embroider the center of the rose with yellow embroidery floss.
4. Sew the leaves onto the oven door around the rose.

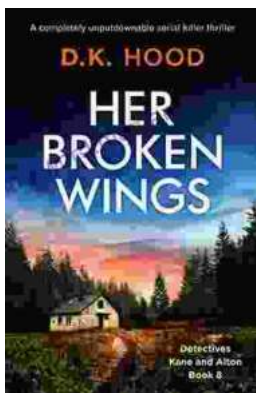


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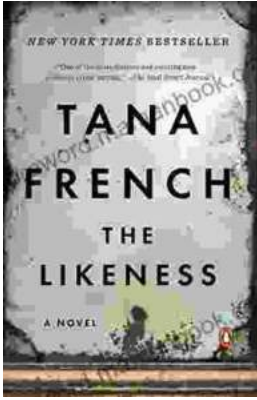
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
