



She sang the "Song of the Shirt."




Ode to a Nightingale

They gallop through the fields, their hooves beating like a drum.


They gallop through the forests, their manes like a black cloud.

I tramped the roads, a weary man, With heavy pack and aching feet, And every night I slept alone, In some cold barn or by the street.


Making Things for Yourself


